Clothing and other used items can be dropped off at the landfill FREE STORE.(we do not accept these items at the depot)

MIXED PLASTIC beverage lids, plastic food containers, soft food packaging (ex, cookie packets), detergents/toiletry bottles, toothbrushes, plastic rope/strapping, ties, Tupperware, plastic toys (lego etc.), hard plastic water containers (ex. Nalgene bottles). ALL HARD PLASTIC EXCLUDES AUTOMOTIVE LUBRICANT CONTAINERS				



A municipal compost is available at the landfill. Composting can divert up to 50% of the waste from the landfill. Please note - ONLY compostable (not biodegradable) bags can go in the compost.

WHAT CAN YOU PUT IN THE COMMUNITY COMPOST?

Food scraps, teabags, coffee filters, soiled paper products like pizza boxes & napkins, waxed cartons, yard waste, sawdust, ect.

NOT - soiled toilet paper, pet feces, cigarettes, glass, plastic etc.



A Household Hazardous Waste Day will be held annually. Store your hazardous waste in a safe place until it can be disposed of safely.

WHAT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Paints, thinners, solvents, cleaning products, pesticides, aerosol cans, motor oil, antifreeze, rechargeable batteries, smoke alarms, fluorescent lights & some personal care items are examples of common hazardous materials found in homes.
